Upholding Academic Aptitude & Integrity **AKASH RANA**

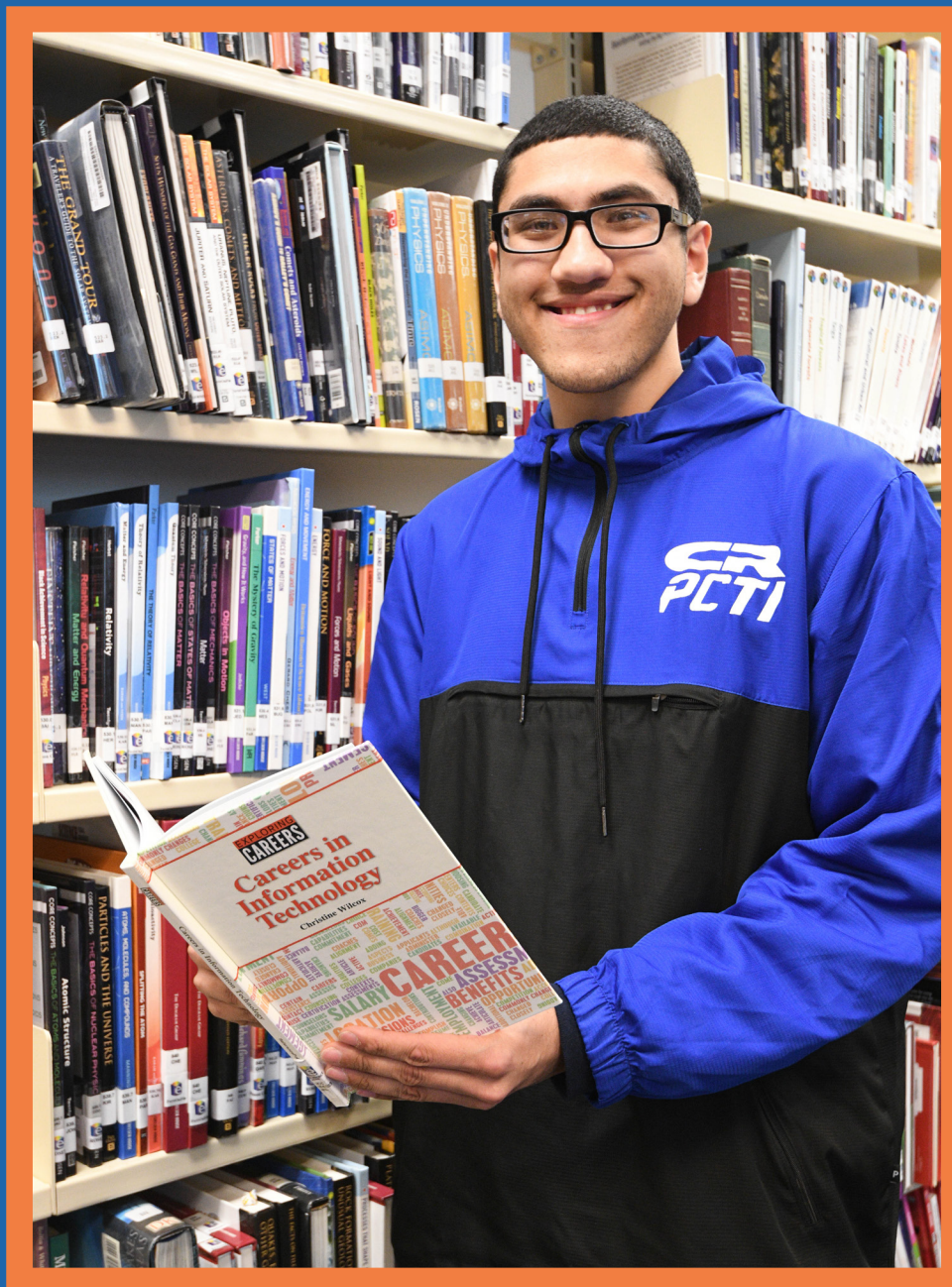
